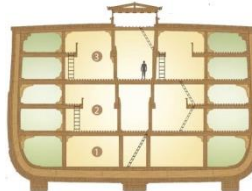
## 22 - Noah's Flood



When the story of Noah's flood is examined closely, we realize that God is telling us much more than is initially obvious. One thing that is overlooked is that in order for all "kinds" of animals to be gathered to the ark before the flood and also for them to all make it to their proper habitats after the flood, the continents had to still be joined together. Koala bears and kangaroos didn't swim to Australia! God tells us in **Genesis (7:19-20)** that all of the high hills and mountains were covered. Mount Everest and a large majority of the Himalayas are over 5 miles above sea level. It would take much more water than is presently on the earth to cover these mountains. This is because these mountains probably didn't exist yet at that time. They were most likely created when the continents split in the days of Peleg (about 100 to 150 years after the flood). This is a theory but it is strongly supported by scripture as well as geological science.

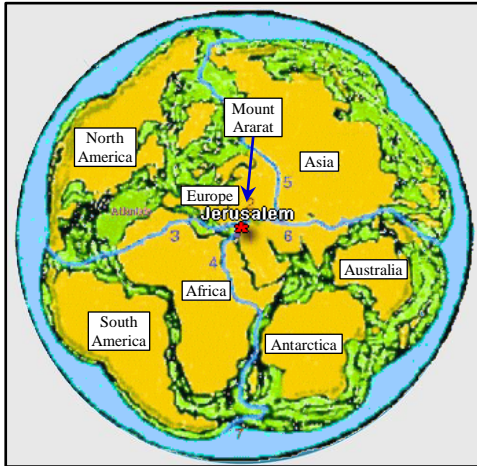
**The Ark - Genesis (9:14-16)**

- Took 120 years to build.
- Length = 300 cubits (450')
- Breadth = 50 cubits (75')
- Height = 30 cubits (45')
- Volume = 1,518,750 ft
- Lower, 2<sup>nd</sup>, and 3<sup>rd</sup> stories

**Genesis (7:2-3)**

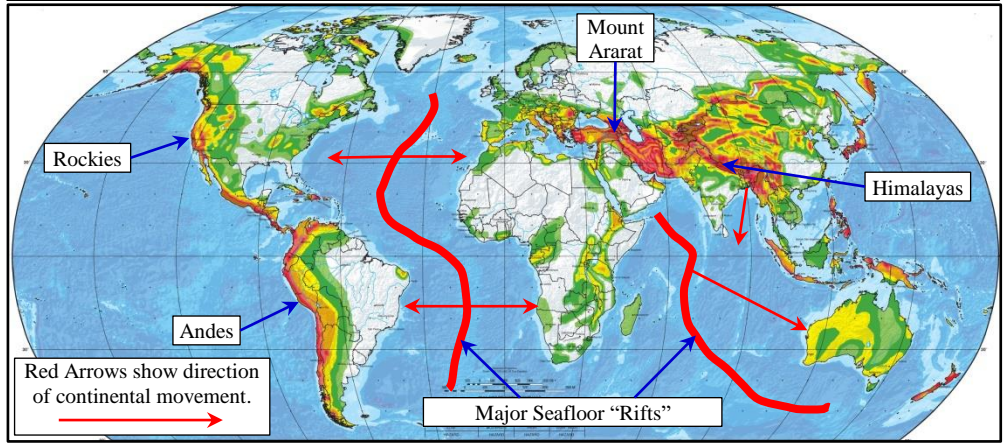
- Seven each of clean beasts and fowls of the air.
- Two each of unclean beasts.
- Male & Female

### Short List of Animals That are Unique to Each Particular Continent

Noah's Ark landed on the mountains of Ararat on the 17th day of the 7th month (**Genesis 8:4**). Animals were released and God put the fear of man into them (**Genesis 9:2**). In order for animals to get to Antarctica, Australia, and North & South America, the continents needed to be joined together at this time. Logically, the continents also had to be connected so that Noah could gather the animals to put onto the ark before the flood. This fits with **Genesis (10:25)** where we are told that the earth was divided in the days of Peleg. It is specifically noted that both the Nations (at the Tower of Babel - **Genesis 10:32**) and the Earth were divided. This allowed at least 100 years for the animals to get to their proper habitats before the continents split. The huge amount of water added to the earth from the flood probably played a major role in the split.
