

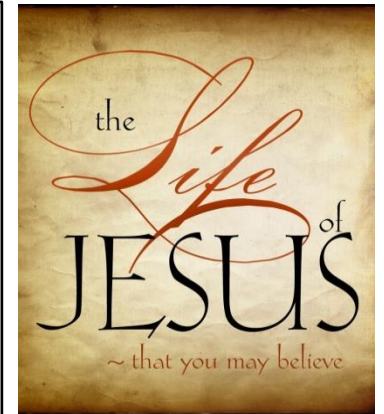
# 40 to 44 - The Life of Jesus Christ on Earth

**Mark:** It is believed that Mark was the first gospel written. All three of the other gospels seem to use Mark as a basis and then add to it. The gospel according to Mark is in chronological order. Mark wrote from the perspective of the "Jesus is a servant".

**Matthew:** It is believed that the Gospel according to Matthew was the second gospel written based on the outline of Mark. Matthew has several chronological inconsistencies which are noted by using (parenthesis) around the verses that are out of order. Matthew wrote from the perspective of the "Jesus is a King".

**Luke:** It is believed that the Gospel according to Luke was written third. Luke used Mark as a guide and expanded it greatly. Luke did the most thorough and comprehensive job of recording the details of Jesus' life. Luke wrote from the perspective of "Jesus is a man". The gospel according to Luke is in chronological order and should be used as the basis for any timeline due to its completeness and thoroughness. Luke notes his thoroughness and orderliness in his opening statement (**Luke 1:1-4**).

**John:** The gospel according to John was written last and is very different from the other three. John wrote from the perspective that "Jesus is God" and has several stories that are not noted in any of the other gospels. The gospel according to John is in chronological order.



## The Ministry of Jesus Christ

Jesus started His ministry around 27 A.D. and it lasted between two and three years until His death around 29 A.D. Theologians break His ministry up into different "phases" and call them different things. I have tried to use the most common breakdown that makes the most sense to me. Geographically, Jesus basically had two main areas where His ministry focused. There was a northern area that was centered around Capernaum and the Sea of Galilee and a Southern area centered around Jerusalem. Throughout the time of Jesus' ministry, He performed at least 42 separate miracles, told at least 57 unique parables, and walked over 3000 miles.

### Timeline Summary For the Ministry of Jesus Christ

- 1) Jesus was baptized at "about thirty years of age" (**Matthew 3:13-17, Mark 1:9-11, Luke 3:21-23**) = Start Point at Time = 0
- 2) Spent 40 days being tempted in the wilderness (**Matthew 4:1-11, Mark 1:12-13, Luke 4:1-13**) = 0 + 40 Days = 40 Days
- 3) Calling of Philip and Nathaniel and wedding at Cana (**John 1:35-2:11**) = 40 Days + 20 Days (Estimate) = 60 Days
- 4) From the wedding at Cana to the 1st Passover Feast (**John 2:23**) = 60 Days + 30 Days (Estimate) = 90 Days
- 5) 2nd Passover Feast (**John 6:4**) = 1 Year + 90 Days = 1 Year and 90 Days
- 6) 3rd Passover Feast (Crucifixion) = 1 Year + 1 Year and 90 Days = **2 Years and 90 Days**

So, the ministry period for Jesus was at least 2 years and 90 days. There is however another "Feast of the Jews" mentioned in **John (5:1)**. It's unknown what this feast was (possibly Pentecost) but if it was a Passover Feast, that would add another year to the ministry of Jesus. Since Jesus was "about thirty years of age" when His ministry started and it lasted at least 2 Years and 90 Days, He was at least 32 and possibly as old as 33 years old when He gave His life on the cross at Calvary.
