



48 - Journeys of The Apostles



Apostle: From the Greek “apostolos” meaning an apostle, messenger, envoy or delegate. This term is used to specifically refer to the original twelve men (also Paul) chosen by Jesus Christ to be missionaries to the areas around the Mediterranean Sea. The twelve apostles are listed in three of the four gospels and Acts. **Matthew (10:1-4), Mark (3:13-19), Luke (6:12-16), Acts (1:13).**

8	Matthew	Gift of Yahweh
9	James (Son of Alphaeus)	English for Jacob

Miracles in the Book of Acts

Scripture	Location	Event
2:1-13	Jerusalem	The apostles received the Holy Spirit and spoke in tongues.
2:43	Many	Many wonders and signs were done by the apostles.
3:1-11	Jerusalem	Peter and John healed a man that was lame from birth
5:1-10	Jerusalem	Peter rebuked Ananias and his wife Saphira and they dropped dead.
5:15-18	Jerusalem	When the sick passed under Peter's shadow, they were healed.
5:19-24	Jerusalem	The angel of the Lord opened the prison doors.
8:5-13	Samaria	Philip cast out spirits and healed the lame with palsies.
8:26-40	Gaza	Philip was transported from Gaza to Azotus by the Holy Spirit.
9:1-9	Road to Damascus	Saul was temporarily blinded by Jesus.
9:10-22	Damascus	Ananias restored Saul's vision by touching him.
9:32-35	Lydda	Peter healed Aeneas who had been lame with palsy for 8 years.
9:36-42	Joppa	Peter brought Tabitha (Dorcas) back from the dead.
10:9-19	Joppa	Peter had a vision while in a trance.
12:4-17	Judea	The angel of the Lord opened the prison door and freed Peter.
13:8-11	Paphos	Paul caused Elymas the Sorcerer to go blind for a season.
14:8-11	Lystra	Paul healed a man that was crippled since birth.
16:16-23	Philippi	Paul cleansed a girl with a demon of divination.
16:23-26	Philippi	The prison doors were opened by an earthquake.
9:11-12	Ephesus	People were healed by touching Paul's handkerchiefs or aprons.
19:13-17	Ephesus	An evil spirit attacked Jewish exorcists.
20:7-12	Troas	Paul raised Eutychus from the dead .
21:8-12	Caesarea	Agabus prophesied about Paul being bound in Jerusalem.
28:1-6	Melita	Paul was bitten by a deadly viper but was unaffected.
28:7-10	Melita	Paul healed the father of Publius from a bloody flux disease.

Notes

- Peter and Andrew were brothers and fishermen.
- James and John were brothers and fishermen.
- Matthew was a tax collector (Publican).
- Judas betrayed Jesus then committed suicide.
- Matthias was chosen by “lot” to replace Judas.
- Paul was called by Jesus near Damascus.
